The SAT

The SAT® tests what students learned in high school and how they apply the knowledge and skills required for college and a 21st-century global economy. As a curriculum-based test, the SAT provides educators with an important measure of academic achievement. The SAT was created to widen access to higher education, and it continues to do so today. Because courses and grading standards vary widely from school to school, scores on the SAT, along with other criteria like high school GPA, help colleges predict a student's ability to succeed in college. SAT Subject Tests

The SAT Subject Tests™ are one-hour-long, content-based tests that give students an opportunity to highlight their academic background and interests in specific subject areas, including math, science, history, literature and languages. Fee Waivers

Eligible college-aspiring students who demonstrate financial need can receive up to two fee waivers for SAT registrations and up to two fee waivers for SAT Subject Test registrations (three Subject Tests allowed per registration). In addition to test fees, the waivers can be used for additional score reports (four for each student), discounts on materials to get ready for test day, and eligibility for application fee waivers from some colleges.

September	Schools receive annual participation materials.
October	Schools complete their participation materials and designate their AP Coordinators. Oct. 15: Preferred date by which administrators should renew previously authorized courses for the 2013-14 school year.
November	AP Course Ledger of authorized 2013-14 AP courses available on the Web. 2013 State and National Summary Reports are posted on collegeboard.org. Nov. 15: Deadline for schools to return the AP Participation Form.
December	The 2013-14 <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> is sent to schools.

2014

January	Schools receive exam ordering information and can begin ordering exams online. Jan. 31: AP Course Audit deadline for new course submissions and renewal of previously authorized courses for 2013-14.
February	Feb. 15: Postmark deadline for College Board AP Fellows grant applications.
March	See the <i>AP Coordinator's Manual</i> or collegeboard.org for AP Exam ordering deadlines. Schools may begin submitting AP Course Audit materials for the 2014-15 school year.
April	Schools receive exam materials.
May	AP Exams are administered. May 5–9, 12–16: Regular testing period. May 21–23: Late-testing period.
June	June 2: Deadline for AP Services to receive all exam materials. June 16: Postmark deadline for AP Services to receive exam payment. Late payments incur a \$200 fee.
July	AP score reports are provided to students, high schools and colleges.
August	School administrators may begin renewing previously authorized courses for the 2014-15 school year.
